## THE BAROQUE

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
- Gets a bad rap: excessive, overstated, overwrought, complicated
- Not one thing: the Pope's baroque was very different than Versailles
- In opposition to Protestant simplicity
- Surprise, wonder, opulence, detail, drama, awe — these are the intended effects
- Comes from Portuguese, “pearl of unusual shape”
- In Rome, it mostly means Bernini







# Bernini, Scala regia

*Trompe l'oeil* (“tricks the eye” in French): the stairs get progressively more narrow and the columns shorter, making the (very short) passageway look long and magnificent. A person walking toward you would appear to get shorter as they approached.
